

Years One and Two – MBA Policies

During the first two years of the three year concurrent degree program, students will be under the progress and probation policies of the MBA program (students will be provided these policies during admission and at orientation and in written policy guides).

A student who does not achieve a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher at the end of all first year courses will be placed on academic probation. If the cumulative GPA at the end of the following semester of courses has not been brought to 3.0 or falls below 3.0 within the second year of the program, the student will be found to have unsatisfactory progress and will be recommended for dismissal from the concurrent degree program.

Moreover, during the first two years of the program, a student who receives a grade below B- in any course will be placed on probation. If a third grade below B- is earned during the first two years, the student will be found to have unsatisfactory progress and will be recommended for dismissal from the concurrent degree program.

During the first two years, a student who receives a grade of D or E or who receives a grade below B in MGT 589 (thesis equivalent course) will not be allowed to continue in the concurrent degree program. The student may restart the program in the following year by retaking the course or courses with deficient grades. Upon restarting, the student will be on probation and any grade below B- will result in unsatisfactory progress and the student will be recommended for dismissal from the concurrent degree program.

If a student receives a grade of incomplete (I) during the first two years, the student will be placed on probation and will have one year to complete the course, otherwise the student will be found to have unsatisfactory progress and will be recommended for dismissal from the concurrent degree program.
